Zinfandel, Turley, Juvenile, California 2017 55

This is a blend of young-vine fruit from 13 different counties in California. Pale to medium rubypurple, the 2017 Zinfandel Juvenile is scented of cinnamon toast and licorice with warm red currants, cranberries, warm black berries and cherries with blue fruits and spicy hints. Arianna Occhipinti, SP68, Rosso, Terre Siciliane 2018 85

Lovely fresh-sage character to complement notes of blueberry compote and citrus, together with crushed violets and lavender. Medium to full body, some bright acidity, firm tannins and a bright finish. Biodynamic & unfiltered. 70 % Frappato & 30% Nero D'Avola WS 90 points | RP 92 points

Barolo, Mauro Molino, Gallinotto, Piemonte 2012 90

Another opulent 2012 from Molino with crushed strawberry, raspberry and lemon rind. Hints of stone. Full body, chewy tannins and a caressing textured finish. A beautiful young wine. Better in 2019 but excellent now. James Suckling 93 points

Cappezzana, 'Ghiaie della Furba', Toscana 2012 85

The currant and sweet tobacco aromas here are prevailing. Full to medium body, silky tannins and a long, flavorful finish. Tight and very polished. Positive focus. Bordeaux style blend: Cabernet | Merlot | Syrah James Suckling 94 points

Barbera D'Asti, La Spinetta 'Ca' di Pian', Piemonte 2015 50

The Barbera grape from Asti tends to show crisper lines and sharper acidity when compared to the Barbera grape from Alba. However, this interpretation is more difficult to peg down. The 2015 Barbera d'Asti Ca' di Pian is a mid-weight effort with a dark appearance and rich concentration. James Suckling 91 points
